From the Minister:

My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness. (2 Cor 12: 9)

I hope you had a happy and blessed Christmas and a good start to the New Year.

The start of a new year is always exciting; something new is beginning. We have our plans and good intentions – we want to do better than in the past year.

But there is always so much to do, particularly in the church – all these people we have to reach out to, we want to tell people about the good news and are working hard to make them listen. But whatever we do, it is never enough. This can be so discouraging; one starts to doubt oneself. Somebody said to me, “I have the feeling of letting God down”. What a relief that there is our bible verse for 2012: “My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness” (2 Cor 12: 9). God said this to St Paul, when he was in great despair, when these other “apostles” seemed to perform so much better than Paul. He was a

weak man. But he was good enough for God, and more so, God says that his power is perfect in weakness. How encouraging for us!

The year is already getting on and soon the Easter cycle will start with the season of Lent. Lent has been the main fasting season for many centuries, and Scotland was the only Protestant country which kept fasting times after the Reformation. This was perhaps mainly to protect the Scottish fishing industry, but nevertheless times set apart for setting aside things we find important and for reflection about our priorities and what we really need in life, times with *less* – and thus with *more* – can be an important sustenance in our circle of life and year.

The Lent group will be the place to share our experiences with giving up treasured things like chocolate or TV: our successes (perhaps even in weight loss) and our failures. But you don't have to be fasting to take part in the Lent Group. It will mainly be a time for studying the Bible. Over seven evenings we are going to read

Mark's passion story. The Holy Gospel according to Mark is the earliest of the four gospels with the passion story at its heart. Mark's Gospel is also called “a passion story with a long foreword”. And we will reflect our experiences and the Bible message in the light of a theme.

For the past 29 years, the Protestant Church in Germany has had a fasting campaign called “7 weeks without”. Each year it stands under a different motto and this year's motto is “7 weeks without – false ambitions”. It challenges our ambitions to create our life ourselves with topics like “Mozart in the womb”, “bilingual toddlers” and the pressure of being younger, prettier, more successful, stronger, better, etc. Our Bible account shall reassure us that we are “good enough” for God's love for his power is perfect in weakness.
