From the Locum Minister:

We find pleasure in setting short term goals for ourselves and then fulfilling those manageable ambitions. I am not a handyman by inclination or ability but over the years I have learned the pleasure of small things achieved. It gives satisfaction to put up a shelf, assemble a cupboard or fix a bit of fence. I have also learned by experience to be realistic about my own capabilities and only take on things that are within my limited range of skills. I have learned the hard way to distrust the lure of the tool box. I can still blush to think of one or two of my least successful projects.

I had a conversation recently with an elder who had in a good natured way taken on a Bible Reading scheme that he soon realised did not suit him.

It was a plan to cover reading the whole Bible in a year. It was a commitment that might interest another person but it was just too much for him. He decided to give it a miss.

Short term goals should be realistic and accept who we are and what we are capable of, what interests us and what moves us. This same elder I can imagine spends much time on visiting and will be a practical and caring friend to a number of people in the course of his work for the church.

When I was asked to take on the work of locum at Chalmers I accepted because it was a short term commitment that I felt I could fulfil. It gives pleasure to help a Church at a time when it must hold steady and seek a new minister.

I do realise however that the modern church is moving on and there are issues to be addressed and this requires the vision and fresh outlook of someone in touch with the fresh thinking moving the church today. It is a pleasure to achieve short term goals but it is vital to work together on a long term vision for the Church.
