From the Minister:

Dear All,

Jesus Christ says: 'For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.' (Matthew 18: 20)

I have now been with you for two months. Although I am still getting to know people and places I can say that my husband Matthew and I are very much enjoying being part of the Chalmers life and new members of the very welcoming and faithful community of Cockenzie and Port Seton.

Nikolaus Ludwig Graf Zinzendorf (1700-1760), the founder of the Moravian Church, left us this beautiful sentence: "I do not hold to Christianity without communion." That could have been written in the Bible. Being a solitary believer, a soloist in the Christian faith, can happen in very specific situations,

but it is not how we are called to live our lives as Christians. Who believes is always drawn to communion with others, into a congregation, to 'those of the family of faith' (Galatians 6:10).

The numbers two or three play an important role in the context of our bible verse for September, Matthew 18:20. Two or three people can witness something; two or three people who pray to God are heard. And two or three believers, who come together in the name of the Lord, can count themselves as members of the family of faith. Two people are enough! If they are praying or tell others about God's presence or to his loving deeds – they can be certain of Christ's presence among them and of his love and support.

It is not the numbers which turn a gathering of people into a 'real church'. Of course we love it when our church is full on a Sunday morning. It can be especially depressing when there are only a handful of children in the Sunday School. We would love them all to come and hear the Good News: we are longing for communion.

However, when we take God's Word seriously, then we shall not let ourselves as the Church be controlled and frustrated by numbers. What we are told is this: to act as Christians to one another and to the people we deal with day by day. Then Jesus Christ is really present among us – and *that* makes us his Church.

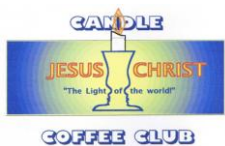

Crisis in Malawi

The Church of Scotland's World Mission Council are extremely concerned with the situation in Malawi following widespread demonstrations which lead to riots, most notably in Lilongwe, Blantyre and Mzuzu. Carol Finlay, World Mission Council said: "Our concern is for the safety and security for all in Malawi, and especially for our Mission Partners (Church of Scotland staff) and for friends & colleagues in our partner church, the Church of Central Africa Presbyterian as they minister to the people of Malawi in this time of uncertainty.

Somalia famine: The World Food Programme (WFP) has begun to airlift emergency food supplies to Mogadishu, capital of famine-struck Somalia. The UN agency is flying in 10 tonnes of food for people suffering amid the worst regional drought for decades.

God of all grace

Who in Jesus cried, 'I thirst',

Hold the people of East Africa in your infinite love.

Be with those for whom the earth's resources have run dry;

Be with those who must walk for miles to find their daily bread;

Be with those for whom survival is a fragile hope.
